Upcoming Casino - Friday, November 22 & Saturday, November 23

The Parents Association has been given the dates for our next casino: **November 22 & 23, 2024** at the Deerfoot Inn & Casino.

Volunteers will be required to cover at least one of the three shifts each day, ranging from 10:00 am to 4:00 am. Each shift includes a meal, and free snacks and drinks from a food allocation provided by the casino, and there is free parking on-site.

After selecting an opened volunteer spot on the website, complete the **Volunteer form** found on the society page and send the signed form to Laurie at ahspa.casinochair@gmail.com or drop it off at Alternative for the Parent Society mailbox.

Volunteers must be 18 or over and must not have had a criminal conviction in the last 5 years. Anyone that meets these criteria can volunteer: parents, adult students, past students, friends, family, etc. The work is easy, and we are supported by professional Casino Advisors throughout the 2-day event. The details of the positions' duties are:

General Manager – This position works closely with the Casino Advisor and with the casino
facility games manager at the Deerfoot Inn & Casino and spends most of their time in the secure
cash cage room. Major duties include conducting opening and closing inventories of the cash
and chips using the CasinoTrack computer system and filling in for other positions when they
take a break.

- <u>Banker</u> The role of the Banker is to supervise the cash cage, supported by the Casino Advisor and General Manager. This includes documenting all cash cage transactions (cash and chips) using the CasinoTrack system.
- <u>Cashier</u> The Cashier interacts directly with casino players by exchanging players' chips for cash. The Cashier works with the General Manager, Banker, Casino Advisor from within the cash cage. The Cashier will verify their till's cash float at the beginning and end of their shift.
- <u>Chip Runner</u> The chip runner opens and closes an inventory of chips at the gaming tables with
 the facility games manager and carries additional chips to the gaming tables when requested
 (always escorted by security personnel). Chip runners spend most of their time in the volunteer
 lounge until needed.
- <u>Count Room Supervisor</u> (11pm-4am shift) The Count Room Supervisor is responsible for all
 count room staff and procedures, fully supported by the Casino Advisor. The Count Room
 Supervisor oversees the counting of cash and chips as the casino closes for the night and also
 enters information into CasinoTrack software. They work with the General Manager, Banker and
 Casino Advisor in the secure count room and cash cage.
- <u>Count Room Staff</u> (11pm-4am shifts) Count Room volunteers take on one of four possible jobs inside the secure count room:
 - Sorter: Sorts all cash or chips by denomination
 - Counter: Counts the sorted cash or chips, by denomination
 - o Recorder: Records the number of bills, coins, and chips counted
 - Amalgamator: Verifies the cash or chips counted and groups them into bundles and summarizes the cash and chips with the Count Room Supervisor.
