- Board of Trustees Letter to Education Minister

Re: Replacement of the weighted moving average Funding Framework Between 2018-2019 and 2024-2025 CBE funding per student adjusted for capital expenditures has remained relatively constant at, or below, 2018-2019 levels but inflation over the same period has eroded purchasing power with that money by 20%. CBEs average cost of labour increased by 8 percent. Funding that would purchase 100 teachers in 2018-2019 can only now fund 92. This has put upward pressure on class sizes and downward pressure on support systems for students.

Funding model has to address adequate funding connected to cost of delivery, transparency, responsiveness and predictability.

System needs another \$1 bil to get on level of other provinces
